<u>Uniform</u>

Learning Behaviour Raffle Ticket

We have started our new reward system and it is proving to be successful. We reward our children for demonstrating good learning behaviour which could be starting a task quickly, listening attentively or answering questions within a lesson. The children will be given a raffle ticket to bring home. Please celebrate this too as it will only be given for fantastic learning behaviour. Then on a Friday a ticket for each year group in the main school is picked out of the box. These children then get to choose from a range of small gifts on a Friday assembly.

We are also continuing with giving out golden moments which the classes collect on a chart. When the chart is full the children choose with their teacher a class reward.

There are consequences for poor behaviour but the most important aspect is understanding what has happened and how an individual's behaviour will impact on others. We use restorative justice systems. We see good behaviour demonstrated on a daily basis and children respond well to the systems we have in place.

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The school development plan

Every year we set targets based on the evaluation of the previous year's evidence and outcomes by the children. This year we are in a strong position as we had a very successful OFSTED inspection. We always strive to provide an excellent start to the children's life long learning journey.

The main aspects of improvement this year are handwriting, spelling and presentation in the curriculum.

We have already started working on these areas with the children. Parents will have seen evidence in the children's books at the parent partnership meetings.

The handwriting programme we use is called Kinetic Letters and focuses on developing strong core physical skills and aims for writing to become automated rather than the children having to think about the formation of individual letters. This process begins as soon as our children start nursery with different sitting positions and clear guidance on holding a pencil. We have decided as a school to only start joining letters when the children are ready, showing strong printed letters. Joining will start, if the children are ready, at the beginning of Year Two.

Please see below the main highlights of the improvement plan. By working on the plan together with the children, staff, parents, governors, directors and community members we will continue to make improvements to our school.

We have made a decision across the site to make our car park a pedestrian only area between 3.10pm and 3.30pm. This means that cars will not have access or be able to leave the site between these times. The car park gates will only be opened for emergency vehicles. We want to ensure the safety of all our children and families. We feel that this will support a safer environment at the end of the day when parents and children are all leaving at the same time.

This will start on Monday 27th November.

Our disabled parents/carers with Blue Badges are welcome to enter before 3.10pm and park safely but are requested to wait until 3.30pm before they leave the site.

This will include all members of our school community. We hope that this will provide a safer and more secure environment for both pedestrians and drivers.

Please could I remind parents dropping off at before and after school club to park **only** in the "lay-by" by the Annex building.
