Transition Survey feedback

Thank you to all those parents and carers who filled in the Transition Survey. There were 196 surveys completed, with 100% saying they would recommend our school. I have looked through all the transition feedback and there are some good points to work on including home visits and drop in sessions for parents to get to know new teachers. Parents said they have found the workshops useful and the vast majority of parents who commented enjoyed spending time in their child's class for activities where they could work together.

I was extremely pleased that many parents sited communication was a positive element of the school. This is an area that we have worked on over the past few years to improve, giving parents as much notice as possible for events and giving parents opportunities to find out about their child's learning. I was also pleased with the overall positive response to our new Autumn term reports, which parents found informative. There were some mixed feedback to the use of Twitter with some parents really enjoying seeing pictures and work of their children in this form. A few parents felt that Twitter wasn't very accessible and therefore not helpful. We will continue to explore ways of sharing what the children are learning in a more immediate form. Teachers will put tips to help with homework and samples of what children have been working on in class to support at home, on Twitter.
