#### We talk about being a good friend at Irthlingborough Nursery and infant School



We are talking at school about doing the best we can do and being the best we can be. As part of this we are talking about anti—bullying and how to deal with bullies. We do not tolerate bullying here! We talk about that bullying means several times of hurting, or calling names on purpose and it is never a one off incident. We talk about **S.T.O.P** as it is important for our children to understand that it is important to talk about their worries. The children have several ways of communicating any worries to the adults in school. This may be telling a trusted adult on their "hand of trust", which all children complete in class and are encouraged to name trusted adults who they would talk to or it could be by writing their name or short note and adding to our worry box. The worry box is regularly checked and then teachers discuss any worries with the children. We also use Worry Monsters and our zones of regulation, which children can indicate how they are feeling through simply moving their name.

Our school's Anti-Bullying booklet has been carefully put together by our School Council to give you information and advice on what to do and where to go if our children don't feel safe or happy at school. This is given out on a yearly basis and is available all year round in the school office.
