We are working very closely with Irthlingborough Junior School to ensure the best transitions for your child as they move from Year Two to Year Three. We have discussed ideas with our parent partnership group, which includes parents, governors and senior leaders from both schools. If you would like to join this group please phone the school so we can invite you to the next meeting.

Your Year Two child will come home with information and login details to Times Table Rock Stars, which has been provided by IJS to support with readiness to Key Stage 2. The children will be able to access this exciting learning platform at home and will use regularly in the Junior School.

## Classes for September 2018

We are beginning to look at classes for September. We are planning to keep the Year Two children together in their classes as they move to Year Three and the Year Ones moving into Year Two. We will however look to mix up the Reception classes as they move into Year One and our Nursery children as they enter into Reception. We feel it is positive for children to make new relationships at certain points and we look at each year group in order to make these decisions. The teachers make these decisions using their observation of the children, friendships and academic outcomes, ensuring classes are evenly balanced. These final decisions will not be made until after the May half term holiday and we will not be discussing these decisions with the children until all classes are finalised so they can meet teachers and transitions can be carefully planned. There will be a number of transition activities particularly with those children moving to Year Three to ensure children have the best start to their new year group. If you have any further questions please do not hesitate to contact your child's class teacher.

## Nursery classes

We still have a few spaces in our fantastic nursery for September 2018. We can offer full days and fully funded places for those parents eligible for 30 hour placements for their child. All children are eligible for 15 hours and additional hours can be paid for. We have a very experienced Nursery teacher leading an exceptional nursery team. The nursery garden and indoor environment offers a safe and exciting space to play, learn and develop social skills and relationships. To start in September your child needs to have turned three by 31<sup>st</sup> August 2018. We will also be accepting children in January for those who turn three by December 31<sup>st</sup> 2018. Our nursery offers the best opportunities for school readiness, through fun, creativity and learning planned by highly qualified and dedicated staff.

## Parents Survey

We had 213 responses to our parent survey and were very pleased with the outcomes. The vast majority of parents were happy with the quality of teaching and learning, their children enjoyed coming to school, felt that the staff responded to worries and that the school was well lead and managed. I was very pleased that parents had found the new termly reports helpful and informed the discussions they had with teachers. Parents also recognised that our school is a safe environment and that communication is a strong priority for us. ## School Attendance special edition



The vast majority of children at our school have excellent attendance and are very rarely absent from school. I felt that now as the warmer weather is approaching and winter illness are on a decrease it was a good time to remind parents of our attendance processes.

Attendance is monitored on a weekly basis as we believe it is important for children to get the education they are entitled to, ensuring they have the best life chances possible.

Average expected attendance at our school is **96%**. A **90%** attendance means that a child is missing the equivalent of 1/2 a day per week, which is a lot of learning time. If this continues as a pattern of attendance for 5 years a child will have missed **half a year of education**.

**80%=1 day missing of learning every week, 70%=1 ½ days every week and 60% =2 days of learning every week.**

**In addition to the above, being late to school can have a considerable impact over the whole school year:**

**5 minutes late every day = 3 days of school lost a year**

**10 minutes late every day = 6.5 days of school lost a year**

**15 minutes late every day = 10 days of school lost a year**

**20 minutes late every day = 13 days of school lost a year**

**30 minutes late every day = 19 days of school lost a year**

You will not be surprised to learn that children with lower attendance do not perform as well at school and ultimately do not do as well in exams and therefore do not get as many qualifications, often leading to more difficulties getting a job in the world of work.

This may seem a long way off for Infant aged children but at this stage the children are developing basic skills that form the basis for life long learning and as the children progress it can get difficult to fill these gaps in their learning.

The government send clear guidance to schools on attendance as for every child this is a legal requirement which parents are responsible for. Holidays in term time cannot be authorised and only absences in exceptional circumstances will be authorised. The local authority can deliver a fixed penalty fine for families who take their children out of school for an unauthorised absence. It is important that parents understand that the initial fixed penalty notice of £60 is issued to **each parent for each child**. A two-parent family with two children would be fined £240. Unauthorised absences can be holidays in term time or when a school is not satisfied that a child has a valid reason to be off school, such as a birthday shopping treat or trip to the hairdressers. We ask that all parents inform the school of any absences as it is important that we know that the child is not missing from education. We have a duty to report all children missing from education to the local authority.

I hope this helps parents to understand the school's and local authority's policy on attendance. If you have any further questions please do not hesitate to contact the school office.

We love to celebrate successes and each week in our Friday assembly, the class with the best or most improved attendance that week is awarded a certificate and 5 golden moments which are collected by the class to receive a treat once 100 have been collected. Each term we also give out certificates for good attendance.
