Parent survey

Uniform

We are very proud of our school and this is reflected in the uniform our children wear. We would however like to remind parents to ensure all pieces of uniform are named. We have over 350 children in school and obviously sweatshirts come off and on during the day. We already have a growing collection of "lost property". Learning Behaviour Raffle Ticket

We reward our children for demonstrating good learning behaviour which could be starting a task quickly, listening attentively or answering questions within a lesson. The children will be given a raffle ticket to bring home. Please celebrate this too as it will only be given for fantastic learning behaviour. Then on a Friday a ticket for each year group in the main school is picked out of the box. These children then get to choose from a range of small gifts on a Friday assembly.

We also give out golden moments which the class collects on a chart. When the chart is full the children choose with their teacher a class reward.

There are consequences for poor behaviour but the most important aspect is understanding what has happened and how an individual's behaviour has impacted on others. We use restorative justice systems, in which we discuss behaviour and how the child can repair the harm. We see good behaviour demonstrated on a daily basis and children respond well to the systems we have in place.

Tissues

We are approaching winter and the coughs and colds we all get spread more easily. Please can each family send in a box of tissues. This will really help as we get through so many with lots of little runny noses!



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Report feedback

World War One -100 years

All year groups will be working on stories, poems and learning about World War One. We feel this is an important event to mark for our children. We hope to display some of the work in our library area after our whole school project.

We will have whole school assemblies and we have chosen some very children friendly stories such as Flo of the Somme and Where the Poppies Grow Now, which will give the children an idea about World War 1.

We will be talking about animals in war as well as the soldiers and their families.

We have decided to do our main section of work after the 11th November so that families will be able to mark this important day in their own family and there may be opportunities to be involved in a parade or just see a ceremony on the television.

If you have any books, photos or if family members have stories about the first world war then please contact your child's class teacher, as we would love to share them.

Great mates

We will be celebrating national Great Mates week along with learning about WW1 next week. Each class will choose their own "Great Mate" and children will discuss what a "great mate" looks like. We will be tackling difficult discussions to ensure children feel safe and secure at school and in the playground. We ensure children have opportunities to talk to adults and share any concerns.

The children on next Friday's special chair, in assembly, will be chosen by the class for demonstrating excellent friendship qualities.

Please note our new values below, which we have been discussing and using as our themes for Friday celebration assemblies. These have come from the work of the school council. We will be looking at helping the children understand these words.



First aid
