Winter Weather

Lending library in Reception, Year One and Year Two

We would like to try changing the way parents come into school to read with their children. We have been having weekly sessions at the end of the day, where those parents who can make it come in and share a book with their child or a small group of children. Some parents have given us feedback that these sessions sometimes feel a little rushed at a time when their children are most tired. We would like to devote some quality time to reading with parents in the school context but maybe not as regularly. We are going to try from next week, stopping the end of the day sessions and introducing a monthly morning session usually on a Tuesday so parents can just come straight into the classroom when they drop off, to read with their child or with a small group. The dates will be given well in advance, so parents know the times. The first session will be next week **Tuesday 5th February** starting at 8.50am until 9.20am. Parents are welcome to stay for a few minutes or up until 9.20am. The second session will be **Wednesday 6th March**, when we will have the book fair in to allow parents to take their child to the book fair, if the wish to do so. We will look for feedback on how these sessions go and in my next newsletter I will hopefully give you a list of dates to get us to the end of the year.

PTA fund raising

I would like to thank the PTA and all of our parents for all their support in raising funds for the school. The large play equipment on the main playground has been totally refurbished. It looks like new! This will ensure the children get plenty more years of fun and activity from the

Driving and parking around the town and school

Please can parents drive and park responsibly around our school and the town. We have had further complaints about poor parking and dangerous driving. The Town Council have employed traffic wardens to help with the parking issue in Irthlingborough and they will issue fines for parking dangerously and illegally.

There is plenty of safe parking in the town by St Peter's Church. Please can I remind parents that the school vehicle access gates are locked between 3.10pm and 3.30pm for all vehicles and there is no access to parent vehicles anytime during the day.

We have heard locally that there will be road closures in College Street and Scarborough Street over the next few weeks. This may further add to the congestion and frustrations around parking near school. Please be aware of this and give yourself plenty of time to walk to school from a little further away.
