#### Learning in Malaga

Mrs Groocock and Mr O'Brien have returned from a very informative course in Spain. They learnt all about using

new technology to enhance children's

There was time to work with teachers from all around Europe and plan creative projects. It was also great to be able to work with staff from our Junior school talking about how this work would progress from starting points at Nursery and the Infant School right through to Year six at IJS. The next two trips being planned are to Iceland and Italy. Mrs Hall is flying to Reykjavik at the end of March to look at special education needs and Mrs Dodds, Miss Knibb and myself are flying to Bologna to further investigate how young children learn through creative experiences and well planned continuous provision. All the projects are funded through the Erasmus Plus programme and requires staff to share their learning with different members of the school community. #### **Reading in School Session**

On Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> March our Book Fair will be here and you are welcome to come and look at the Book Fair books with your child during this session.

As a school we have a major focus on reading this year and to support a key skill for reading and phonics, we are changing our timetable. Phonics will be taught first

We feel that the children will be brighter and easier to encourage in this learning. Please continue to read and practise phonics and spelling at home as this will support your child.
