

Learning adventures into a global curriculum in Italy

Mrs Marshall, Mrs Dodds and Miss Knibb along with Mrs Lloyd Williams and Miss Day from Finedon Infant School, had an amazing experience in Bologna, Italy. They were able to see the creative approaches to education in Reggio Emilia schools



and visited the Loris Malaguzzi Centre for research. They worked with Italian and Swedish teachers and also a group of teachers from Croydon! Mrs Marshall and the Foundation Stage team are putting together a plan to use some of the creative approaches in our nursery and reception classes. There were some wonderful examples of drawing from very young children. All of the children we worked with were Year One or below. Play 'I Spy' games. Can you find words beginning with...? Can you find a picture of a ...? How many ... can you see?

Ask questions

Ask questions about the story as you read it e.g. What is the story about? Why do you think they made that choice? Was it a good choice? Why did that happen? What do you think will happen next? What was your favourite part of the story? Why?

Make it fun

Enjoy reading together. Give characters funny voices and engage with the pictures. Make a game out of finding words that rhyme or start with the same sound.

Create

Use reading to inspire drawings or new stories.

Be seen

Make sure you are seen reading. Keep books and magazines at easy reach.

Go online

Look online & in app stores for appropriate word & spelling games.

Get out

Go to your public library regularly. Find the books you loved as a kid to read together.

Make space

Have a special place or a certain time when you read together.

Read everything out loud.

Books, poems, nursery rhymes, newspaper & magazine articles, food labels...
