



# **Head Teacher Update**

We had a great science week last week and made lots of exciting scientific memories with the children! We are really looking forward to **welcoming parents** into school this week and next for the parent and carers partnership meetings, in person! We know for some of you it will be the first time you have been inside your child's class due to the past Covid restrictions. Please enter school via the main door at the office. We will also be seeking your views to help our school further improve in a short questionnaire.

# Science

Our Science curriculum is based around practical experiences that engage the children and also allow them to experience the awe and wonder of the world around them.

Our well-planned science curriculum allows children to know more, remember more and explain more, therefore demonstrating a secure progression across the different concepts. The use of key assessment questions within each concept allows teachers to make ongoing assessments and if needed, make relevant and appropriate changes to the planning from this. Teachers will use these weekly assessments to complete wholeschool assessments each term, which are analysed by the science subject leader. The use of Collins Snap Science helps improve and support the consistency of science across the whole school, the resources children access and the children's ability to use a range of scientific vocabulary. Learning environments and discussions with children clearly highlight the progression between each year group and the skills the children achieve. The profile of science across the whole school is raised with children completing science-specific tasks at school with confidence, curiosity, and creativity.

Our science scheme ensures our children have the skills they need when they move into the Junior School and Key Stage Two.

### **Chicken Pox**

We have several cases of chicken pox at present, please be vigilant to any signs of this. Here are a few suggestions to help if your child has chicken pox.

Remember you need to let us know everyday your child is off by ringing the school office.

#### Do

- drink plenty of fluid (try ice lollies if your child is not drinking) to avoid dehydration
- ✓ take <u>paracetamol</u> to help with pain and discomfort
- cut your child's fingernails and put socks on their hands at night to stop them scratching
- ✓ use cooling creams or gels from a pharmacy
- speak to a pharmacist about using <u>antihistamine medicine</u> to help itching
- ✓ bathe in cool water and pat the skin dry (do not rub)
- ✓ dress in loose clothes

#### Don't

- do not use <u>ibuprofen</u> unless advised to do so by a doctor, as it may cause serious skin infections
- 🗶 do not give aspirin to children under 16
- do not go near newborn babies, people who are pregnant and people with a weakened immune system, as chickenpox can be dangerous for them
- × do not scratch the spots, as scratching can cause scarring

# **World Book Day**

We had a wonderful World Book Day, with the children celebrating books and reading, sharing their favourite books and finding new ones! We want to thank all the parents who came to our book fair and used their book tokens with us. There was a lovely selection of books to really engage your child's love of reading. We will get a little bit of commission from each sale that will go back to your child as we restock our library. We gave out lots of books to our children over lockdown and now, particularly our fiction selection is looking very depleted. We again want to ensure we buy a range of quality, diverse books, encouraging children to love reading for pleasure. We will keep you informed of our next steps with the library.

Please note reading book changes are on Mondays for Year Two and Reception and Tuesdays for Year One. Please ensure that you read the books in your child's book bag daily as one read is never enough. Try and keep the books in the bag everyday to bring to school as the children need their books at various points in the week.





# **Scooters in School**

It has been lovely to see number of children using their scooters to come to school on and exercise on their journey. However, I have noticed that particularly at the end of the day when all children are leaving at the same time, some children have been scooting on the playground and bumping into other children and adults as it is so busy. Please can you carry your child's scooter on the playground and only allow them to scoot when it is safe and there are not crowds of people, off the playground. Scooters can be parked outside of nursery, under the canopy by the wall. There is space for six scooters here, they cannot be locked so if they are left, it is completely at the parent's own risk and we will not be held accountable for any scooter that goes missing.

We do not want to stop children scooting to school when it is safe but parents need to be responsible for the safety of others and by carrying the scooters on the playground this will alleviate the problem and ensure children can still have fun on their scooters but also remain safe for everyone. #### Covid update

We have an increasing number of Covid cases at present and this is impacting on staff and children. Please can you continue to be vigilant and take your child for a PCR if they show symptoms. We are asking children and staff not to be in school if they have Covid and to test negative on two consecutive days before returning to school. LFDs can still be ordered for free.

# Uniform

Thank you to those parents who have now provided an outdoor PE kit for the children in Year One and Two. Teachers plan for indoor lessons every week and outdoor lesson once a fortnight so the children need their kit in school. They can keep PE kits in school as they don't need washing after every lesson.

We have noticed that some children do not have school shoes. All children at INIS have an active curriculum so we therefore need to ensure the children have suitable footwear as well as the well thought out uniform to give the children a sense of belonging. Please remember school shoes should be plain black. We do allow trainers if they are plain black. If you have any problems with purchasing appropriate uniform do not hesitate to contact the school office. We would prefer you to buy second hand where possible as we have lots of good quality jumpers and cardigans in school. Please also ensure that children do not have over large hairbands such as cat ears or unicorns for everyday. These are fine for Mufti Days but not for everyday.


