# **Reading - Key to learning**

At INIS we believe every child has a right to learn to read quickly. To support our Early Reading and **Phonics** we use Essential Letters and Sounds which is a complete systematic, synthetic phonics programme.

One of the key things that can help to support your child to read is by using the correct pronunciation of letter sounds. Please use the following links to see how we are teaching the letter sounds:

We want every child to love reading, hence we would like to promote reading with asking you to add photos of children reading on Twitter over half term.

We give the children lots of opportunities to share books in class, through reading lessons, guided reading practise, using the library, reading caravan and class book corners. The teachers and teaching assistants also love reading stories to the children. In assembly recently, I asked the children who had a bedtime story and only about half put their hand up. This is a great opportunity to begin to develop your child's love of reading and to have a great bed time routine.

## **Reading Books**

The reading books children bring home are matched to the children's phonic abilities. The reading books will be familiar to the children. They will be reading books that they have read in school. This does mean that children might bring home a reading book they have had before if they are continuing to work on reading with fluency at a certain level.

The purpose is to practise reading for fluency with expression at every level. Please encourage your child to use their finger to track the words and use their phonic knowledge rather than predicting words from pictures.

Comprehension only develops once children have read a book, become familiar with the book and they are able to read it with automaticity.

Reading books where children can read with automaticity will develop the feelings of success and children seeing themselves as independent readers. This is crucial if they are to develop a love of reading!





# **Planet League is underway!**


