

School Improvement Plan

Each year we set a school improvement plan on the things we have seen could improve further to support our children at INIS. This year we are looking in particular to develop oracy and our children's ability to communicate their knowledge and learning. The teachers have already had training from an external oracy expert to develop their skills in this vital area.

We have focused on the key skill of reading, to encourage our children to be fluent, enthusiastic and capable readers. Our children make great progress in reading, however we want to ensure that they develop that love of books and importantly fluency and confidence. This will allow them access to so many opportunities for learning. We have focused on a couple of areas in the curriculum where we have had new resources to focus our teaching, such as in history, geography and PE. Our subject leaders are carefully monitoring the teaching and learning to ensure all our children can have the very best outcomes. In Nursery and Reception our additional focus is fine motor skills, to help with writing and drawing for the future.

We have continued our work on mental health and wellbeing for our children as this is vital to develop positive relationships, strong self esteems and positive attitudes to the diverse world in which we all live. 
